## VII. REPORTING BACK AND PLANNING AHEAD

- **Groups writing up** for the Learner Development SIG website (via Google docs) - possible areas to include in your group write-up:
  - > Summary of the pair/group discussion, including where different people are coming from with their interest in the thematic focus of the pair/group (puzzles, questions)
  - > Interesting points/issues in the discussion
  - > Reflections on, connections to, your own/your learners' practices
  - > Next steps that people agree in the pair/group to take before the following get-together AND/OR New paths that could be explored at the next get-together
