# Learner Development SIG Annual General Meeting (AGM) Minutes Saturday 13th November 6.30-7.40 PM

## I. Introduction

- i. **Warm-up chat & introduction by Koki** We decide to stay in the main session rather than break out. Koki announces Aya Hayasaki as research grant awardee and that she will contribute a grant awardee essay to the Spring 2022 issue of *Learning Learning*.
- ii. Self-introductions by all present with Tim Cleminson starting off as the incoming coordinator

## **II. Committee Review**

#### A. Involving new members

Andy points out that 30 people have left the SIG and **40 new members have joined since**November **2020**, with the SIG membership total currently around the low 170s. What are some ways in which we can **involve new members**? Tim C suggests **targeting new members for get-togethers**, and later the suggestion is made to produce **an issue of Learning Learning** with a strong focus on new members sharing short pieces of writing.

## B. Surveying SIG members

- i. Ellen asks whether there is any way to find out why people have joined the SIG and mentions that it might be useful to do a survey of LD members. Blair points out that the question was raised in the forum in the morning (why you joined, what inspired you to join, and why), and Tim C responds that they are great questions, but they need time to respond.
- ii. Tim Ashwell asks whether the link to the Google Form used in the Forum could be sent to LD members for their responses, as there was limited time in the forum for people to write. People attending the forum had been more concerned with sharing comments and questions with the presenters.

#### C. 2021 Grant awardee

(18.51) **Aya Hayasaki** joins and is welcomed by Koki. Aya introduces herself. She mentioned that she really enjoyed presenting at the **LD forum** today and that she has been working on **LDJ7**. She greatly appreciates all the support and warm welcome from LD, especially the fact the SIG **focuses on process**.

## D. Changes in key committee positions

Koki provides a brief summary of people stepping up and people stepping down in the committee, emphasising that LD needs to have a full slate of 5 core officers (coordinator, treasurer, programme, membership, publicity), otherwise we can't be formally recognised as a SIG by JALT. For 2022 the positions of programme (currently Blair) and publicity (currently Ellen) need new people, better a pair or trio working together, with initial support from Blair and Ellen respectively.

## E. Tim C's story & focus

- i. (18.55) Tim C makes an appeal for people to step forward and gave a brief presentation through a series of visuals to share his story of how he became involved in LD and what he sees as important for the SIG as he starts out as coordinator. Tim thanked everyone for the opportunity to represent the SIG and for the support that he has received today. He sees learner development as a vibrant community.
- ii. When he joined the SIG, he was **invited to contribute a Members' Voices piece to Learning Learning** and then got some really **great feedback from Lorna Asami and Mike Kuziw in the redrafting and development process**. Tim attended CCLT6 last December and then started joining Tokyo get-togethers and had a **real sense of community**.
- lii. If we think about our overall situation at the moment, Tim continued, we are probably suffering from too much screen time and may feel that we have experienced a loss of autonomy in our work (for example, by being asked to provide video-on-demand classes). We may also have a sense of burn-out. For Tim the LD SIG has been a real source of strength. Making connections to learner autonomy helping students become more autonomous, Tim said that it's all about interdependence and quality of communication.
- iv. In the final part of his short presentation. Tim C mentioned that he has only been in LD a short time so he doesn't fully understand the history of the SIG, so his priority over the coming year is understanding the community and puzzling over what LD does.
- v. Tim C feels that the spirit in which we do this is really important. Having a sense of joy about what we do is key, together with the process of puzzling and the feeling of adventure that we have in starting something new together. LD is a great mentoring community, and he wants to try to bring in more of our members and support them in similar ways to how he himself has been supported.
- vi. Koki thanks Tim and explains that he will help Tim C over the coming year in a shadow role as the outgoing coordinator. Koki repeats that we need to recruit people for key roles.

#### F. Treasurer's report

i. (19:05) Patrick provides the treasurer's report, explaining that **online-ness of the last year has affected the SIG's finances and kept costs down**. (On announcing this, Patrick's Zoom connection dramatically went (!), and Koki continued the financial report for a few minutes until Patrick could rejoin.)

ii. The key point is that the SIG has a healthy balance for the coming year, so we will be able to continue awarding LD grants, even if a return to face-to-face conferences in 2022 may involve other costs (such as takkyubining LD display materials to and from conference venues). Tim C also mentioned that it's important to publicise that diverse types of grants are distributed. For example, smaller grants are available to fund LD members presenting at online and face-to-face conferences.

#### G. Welcome to Dawn Lucovich

Dawn Lucovich, JALT President, joins the AGM and is welcomed. Dawn explains that she is there to listen to part of our AGM and see what the LD SIG is focusing on.

iii. Note: Next year's **JALT2022** conference will be in **Fukuoka** (12-15 November; theme: **Reflections and New Perspectives**), with **PanSIG2022** at the **University of Nagano** (8-10 July; theme: **(Re)imagining language education**; Koki is the conference chair).

#### III. Announcements

#### A. LDJ7

- i. As one of the Learner Development Journal 7 editors, Ellen shared how **excited she is about LDJ7**. She mentioned that the LDJ7 editors may rely on the Journal Steering Group as they are **not that experienced as editors**. Aya continued by focusing on the theme of LDJ7, **Challenging the Conventions in Learner Development Research**. They had at first planned to put the focus on learner autonomy, but decided in the end to have a broader focus.
- ii. Andy commented that it is great to have a variety of genres for LDJ7 ("papers" and "practice-related reviews") and mentioned how this is a strong feature of LDJ5 (narrative accounts and practice-related reviews) with writers experimenting in the way they write.
- iii. Ellen explained that the LDJ7 editors (**Aya Hayasaki**, **Ellen Head**, and **Ryo Moriya**) have all been writers for previous issues of LDJ. In their experience they really appreciated having the chance to talk with other writers as part of the process. Aya and Ellen felt that a unique focus will emerge from the discussions and collaboration over time.
- iv. Ellen mentioned that the editors had talked about making a video Call for Contributions, to explain more about the philosophy of LDJ. She felt there is a certain ambiguity and tension in focusing on process and conforming to journal-like quality in the writing, and that was something they will have to navigate as they go.
- v. So far the editors have had a couple of **Zoom meetings among themselves and with the journal steering group**. They are also trying to encourage another person to join them as a co-editor.
- vi. There has been a little delay with sending out the CfP to LD members (although it was "leaked" to the AUTO-L listserv). Ellen is concerned about the SIG sending too many messages to SIG members, so the LDJ7 editors decided to wait until after the conference to announce the CfP to SIG members.
- vii. Tim Ashwell mentioned that it would be **good to send it soon** so people have plenty of time to think about it. (**The deadline for proposals is 31st January 2022**.)
- viii. Ellen observed that the quality of *Learning Learning* is so high that it will be interesting to see how everything goes for LDJ7.

#### B. Welcome to Gabriela Schmidt

Gabriela, 2021 PanSIG chair, CEFR & Portfolio SIG coordinator, and long-time LD SIG member, joins the AGM and is welcomed.

## C. Creating Community: Learning Together 7 (CCLT7)

i. Tim C gave an update on preparations and plans for CCLT7. In the past CCLT has been presentation based, and this year we are looking to something different, more discussion based, with students sharing a story and puzzles about their learning lives over the last year.

- ii. LD members will be there to facilitate the students' discussion: **Students will be in groups of four, with one teacher as facilitator**.
- iii. The aim is for students from different schools and universities to have discussions with each other.
- iv. **12th December Sunday afternoon for 2** ½ **hours 3 hours or so**, hosted by lan Hurrell in Zoom.
- v. Tim Ashwell explained that Ian has **drafted an email and Google Form that people are providing feedback over the weekend**. More information will be going soon to LD members.
- vi. One aim this year is to try and keep the event low maintenance.
- vii. Teachers may also share stories and puzzles and form their own discussion groups.

## D. Publicity messaging

- i. Ellen asked whether **the next CCLT7 message** to SIG members could be **combined with the LDJ7 CfP**.
- ii. Tim C agreed that the question of **information overload** is very important to keep in mind in messaging LD members.
- iii. Ellen responded that it will take **ongoing discussion between different teams in the committee** to get their publicity needs coordinated.
- iv. Tim C asked whether LD could have **a publicity team** as quite a lot of chapters do this and it would be good if the role could be shared in LD. **Making messages visual** is very important too.
- v. Ellen replied that it depends on what people want to do.
- vi. Andy clarified that **LD did use to have a publicity team** (Rob Moreau, Mayumi Takizawa, and Kie Yamamoto). He explained that Rob Moreau, **LD SIG illustrator**, is always willing to design a logo for different LD events, but he is no longer involved in publicity messaging.

#### E. SIG logo

- i. (19:32) Tim C suggested that **the SIG logo is of a certain time**, and it might be good for the SIG to update and **create a new logo**.
- ii. Ellen thanked Jenny for representing LD in a joint event with Hiroshima Chapter in October and reminded the committee that joint events with other chapters or SIGs are a good way of stimulating our thinking about LD and increasing participation. She thanked Jim Ronald in absentia for publicising and funding the event, which was attended by between 30 and 40 people.

#### F. Communication tool: Basecamp

i. Koki gave a brief introduction to <u>Basecamp</u>, a project management and team communication tool, which different parts of JALT have been moving to for their communications.

- ii. Koki and Tim C would like to see **LD shift committee communications away from email to Basecamp**.
- iii. Please email Koki if you would like to join Basecamp!

## IV. Thank yous

- i. Koki started to wrap things up and say his goodbyes and hand over formally to Tim C.
- ii. On behalf of everybody present Andy expressed immense gratitude to Koki for everything that he has done in the last 4 years as SIG coordinator: We all owe Koki our great thanks. Applause for Koki and many thank yous.
- iii. Koki then made **Tim C the host of the meeting**, and left.
- iv. On behalf of everybody present Tim Ashwell **welcomed Tim C and thanked him for taking the reins as LD SIG coordinator**. Applause for Tim and many thank yous.
- v. Around 19:40 the AGM closed and moved into **informal socialising chatter and discussion**.
